About learning a language

Receptive skills: what you read or listen to – "uncontrollable", often more than you can fully understand

Productive skills: what you write or speak – often simpler and more focused especially in learning situations

Immerse yourself in Finnish:

- Listen to Finnish music
- See tv-series (with subtitles, e.g. funny comedy Luottomies / Wingman in YLE Areena)
- Find social media accounts in Finnish (e.g. Uusikielemme on Instagram is very good)
- What are you interested in? Find something related to that in Finnish e.g. a hobby!
- Switch the language of your phone and laptop to Finnish
- Take LOTS of pictures of advertisements and texts you see in Finnish
- Post-it your apartment with words
- Think of learning as a game: 'collect them all'
- Speak and write Finnish whenever possible and don't be afraid of mixing languages or asking for meanings!
- Strategies when e.g. reading: try to understand the main idea, create a mindmap / list of most important words, translate, guess the meaning of words based on the context
